Sydney Western City Planning Panel is the determination authority for this development application.

Lot 1 Pembroke Road, Minto

Council has received amended plans from Anglican Community Services for the staged seniors living development for 10 residential flat buildings comprising 345 independent living units, a 100 bed residential aged care facility, community facilities and associated carpark at Lot 1 DP 620265, Pembroke Road, Minto. The applicant has lodged amended plans as part of an appeal to the Land and Environment Court against the deemed refusal of the application by Council.

The proposal is identified as Nominated Integrated Development as it requires a controlled activity approval from the Office of Water under the Water Management Act 2000, and Bushfire Safety Authority from the Rural Fire Service under the Rural Fires Act 1997.

The amended application and accompanying Statement of Environmental Effects are on exhibition and available for review at the ground floor of Council's Civic Centre during Council's ordinary office hours; and at HJ Daley Library, Hurley St, Campbelltown and Greg Percival Library, Cnr Oxford and Cumberland Rds, Ingleburn.
