

The buildings and landscaping features that will surround the stunning feature pools of the Campbelltown Billabong Parklands are underway.

## SPOT A GANG-GANG Cockatoo

A new project in Campbelltown will test whether gang-gang cockatoos will use specially designed habitat such as habitat boxes and how climate change might affect them in the future.

The project builds on a successful citizen scientist research program to identify gang-gang hollow locations around Campbelltown.

Volunteers from our Bushcare program and Macarthur Birds assisted the research program.
