

INGLEBURN DAM

Lot Pt. 7 DP 596839 St Andrews Road, Varroville
Multiple arch reinforced concrete dam, built 1934





HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:

A multiple-arch reinforced concrete dam with a capacity of 9.25 million gallons, adjacent to the Upper Canal.

Built in 1934 to provide reserve storage when the Upper canal is laid off for maintenance, it was the first dam of this type to be constructed in connection with the Sydney water Supply System. It serves an extensive area.

CONDITION AND USE:

Still in use as a dam.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE:

- The dam is still important as a source of water for nearby urban areas. Listed on Water Board's Interim S. 170 Heritage Inventory.
- It has Historical and Architectural significance
