

# *CAMPBELLFIELD (REDFERN'S COTTAGE)*

Lot 50 DP 1028174, Lind Street, Minto



**HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:**

Campbellfield was built on a grant made to Dr William Redfern in 1811 (800 acres) who had come to the colony as a convict in 1801 and he was a skilled medical practitioner and became a respected colonist. He retired to his farm at Campbellfield after 1816, later adding to its acreage and built a simple brick house there with a stone-flagged eastern verandah, presumably before 1820. There was a deep, stone-lined cellar at the southern end.

**CONDITION AND USE:**

It is still occupied as a dwelling. Over the years previous to the disastrous treatment of the mid-1960's there had been some alterations and additions – there was evidence of former small attic windows, the rear verandah was closed in the house extended at the northern end. A detached kitchen and stables were demolished some time ago. The new roof has obliterated the old roof-line and the front wall of the house was rebuilt entirely. Remaining from the original building is the stone-flagged verandah, one chimney and the stone-walled cellar, now partly filled with rubble.
