HOUSE – CONDAMINE STREET

Lot 1 DP 917059 No. 2 Condamine Street, Campbelltown Weatherboard House



HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:

This is one of several late nineteenth century/early twentieth century houses, which are found on the hillside streets of Campbelltown. The houses range in age from approximately 1860 or 1870 (early chimneys and small paned windows) to the first decades of the twentieth century. Several of these houses show details that suggest that a single builder constructed them.

The house at No. 2 Condamine Street was built in c.1910 in the colonial style. It is a simple weatherboard/iron cottage with original chimneys extant. Simple window hood on the eastern elevation. Sympathetic timber picket fence of suitable dimensions. Good intact timber cottages such as this are becoming increasingly rare in Campbelltown.

CONDITION AND USE:

Well kept from outside, internal condition unknown. The building is currently in use as a private dwelling.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE:

- The building has Historical, Architectural and Aesthetic significance
- It is of local significance to Campbelltown because:
 - it represents (with others in the group) the character of Campbelltown when it was an early Australian country town.
 - A good intact example of early town cottages in the colonial tradition.
 - Weatherboard cottages once common in Campbelltown are becoming rare.
