# **OSBALDESTON**

### **HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:**

This stone cottage was built by a Mr Barnes between 1932 and 1934. The house is named after a town in Lancashire, United Kingdom, where the Barnes family came from. The house has remained the property of the Barnes family since, being passed on to Miss Mary Barnes (aged 84) who's father built the house.

The house is a bush cottage with low ceilings, built of stones and rock found on the property.

## **CONDITION AND USE:**

Some major cracking is visible externally, a structural engineers report would be required to determine the extent to which such cracking is affecting the stability of the building.

## **HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE:**

- The building is of Archaeological and Aesthetic significance
- It is of local significance to Campbelltown because:
  - it is a rare and unique example of vernacular architecture in the area and possible Sydney;
  - it is associated with the established Barnes Family who have had continual ownership of the property; and
  - it remains in its original condition.
