

THE JUG/STONE COTTAGE

Lot 315 DP 253229 No. 9 Ben Lomond Road, Minto Heights

Stone Cottage built after 1886



HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:

This is an interesting little three-roomed stone cottage built of rusticated stone but with dressed stone doorways and corner quoining. The property was part of the Campbellfield subdivision and this property was bought by Elizabeth Chaperon, who bought three 3) portions for 700 ponds in 1886. She built the small stone cottage, which was later known as "The Jug" as one of the rooms had a still. It was once surrounded by a vineyard, but all traces of the vines have now disappeared.

CONDITION AND USE:

Well kept by Mr and Mrs Tilbury. The windows and doors were replaced (in the 1950's) as they were broken up when the building had been vacant. Modern additions have been made in weatherboard at the rear, without detracting from the character of the original building. A small attractive garden fronts the cottage.
