Ruins of a Church Building



HISTORY AND DESCRIPTION:

Built on local subscription by William Woods and opened in October 1898. The site was donated by postmistress Elizabeth Greenwood. Previous to the church being built, services were held at Greenwood's Post Office nearby. The church burnt down in 1913 and was rebuilt the same year.

CONDITION AND USE:

The building is now only a husk and has not been used for sometime. Now in a horse paddock.

HERITAGE SIGNIFICANCE:

- The building has historic significance
- One of the few early buildings remaining in Wedderburn.
