#### 4. REPORTS

4.1 Demolition of existing structures, removal of all trees and subdivision into 3 Torrens title allotments - 8 Figtree Crescent, Glen Alpine

# **Executive Summary**

- This application proposes the demolition of all existing structures and removal of all trees at 8 Figtree Crescent, Glen Alpine, and subdivision of the site into three Torrens title allotments. The proposed development does not include the construction of buildings.
- The application complies with the relevant provisions of the Campbelltown Local Environmental Plan 2015 and the Campbelltown Sustainable City Development Control Plan 2015.
- The application was notified to nearby and adjoining residents. Council has received submissions from the residents of 15 properties, objecting to the application.
- It is recommended to the Panel that the application be approved subject to the attached recommended conditions of consent.

#### **Public Address**

The Local Planning Panel was addressed by Mr Paul Scott.

Panel members asked questions that were responded to directly at the meeting.

### Panel Considerations and Reasons for Decision

- The panel considered the written and verbal objections, noted the matters raised and took all of these submissions into account in determining the application. The panel understands that the private covenant is not now enforceable due to the standard provisions in all local planning instruments including Campbelltown Local Environmental Plan 2015.
- The proposed development is consistent with the objectives of the R2 Low Density Residential Zone listed in Campbelltown Local Environmental Plan 2015.
- While the proposed lots sizes are not the same as those of the surrounding area, they
  comply with the applicable minimum lot size under Campbelltown Local Environmental
  Plan 2015.
- The proposal complies with the requirements of the Campbelltown (Sustainable City)
   Development Control Plan 2015.
- The matters raised by objectors to the application, being the character of Glen Alpine, traffic and road safety, the private covenant and the impact on property values have been addressed in the officers report.
- The trees to be removed are not native, are not of ecological or other significance and their removal has been justified by an arboricultural assessment.
- The Panel notes that Council is about to embark on an LEP review process including preparation of Local Character Statements, a Housing Strategy and Local Strategic Planning Statement. As part of the process the Panel suggests that Council gives attention to establishing the desired future character of Glen Alpine in consultation with the community and aligning appropriate planning controls to that character.

#### **Decision of the Panel**

That the application be approved subject to the conditions attached to the report.

### 4.2 Control and Direction Delegation

# **Executive Summary**

- Due to recent amendments to the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act), the Local Planning Panel currently has the control and direction of the conduct of the proceedings in any Planning Appeals relating to a determination of the Local Planning Panel.
- Recent advice issued by the Department of Planning and Environment advises that each Local Planning Panel should have a clear process for management of appeals against the decision of the panel.

- Section 2.20(8) of the EP&A Act allows Local Planning Panels to delegate any of their functions to the General Manager.
- To ensure the orderly and cost effective management of judicial review proceedings relating to a determination of the Panel, it is recommended the Local Planning Panel delegate its functions under section 8.15(4) of the EP&A Act, to the General Manager.

#### **Decision of the Panel**

The Panel endorses the delegation of functions as referred to in Part 8 Division 8.3 of the EP&A Act subject to the following amendments:

- The current item 2 become Item 1
- Item 1 be amended to add the words after Panel, "that made the decision"
- Amend new Item 2, to insert "ongoing" before "conduct" in line three.

The Panel also recommends that all Panel members be notified of the outcomes of all appeals pertaining to applications determined by the Panel.
