

Hours of work and traffic impacts

Construction works will be managed in a way so that there is no impact to the commuter traffic in the area. Works will usually be carried out from Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and on Saturdays from 7am to 1pm. Potentially affected residents will be advised if any works need to take place outside these normal hours. Council will advise on the construction commencement date and completion date in the coming days.

Background


The Australian Government has approved the funding of \$5.76 million towards the upgrade of Badgally Road between Clydesdale Drive and North Steyne Road from its existing two lanes to four lanes. This project is a part of the Federal Government's Western Sydney Infrastructure Plan (WSIP) - Local Government Package to support Western Sydney.

Western Sydney Infrastructure Plan

The Australian and NSW governments are funding a 10 year, \$3.6 billion road investment program for western Sydney. The Western Sydney Infrastructure Plan will deliver major road infrastructure upgrades to support an integrated transport solution for the region and capitalise on the economic benefits from Western Sydney Airport.

The Eagle Vale Drive upgrade project is part of the \$200 million Local Roads Package, funded by the Australian Government under the Western Sydney Infrastructure Plan.


Benefits of the project

This section of the road is about 1.25 kilometres long and will be a key link road transport corridor servicing East/West connections from/to Campbelltown CBD. It will have the following additional benefits:

- Improve safety for all road users
- Reduction in congestion on Badgally Road - improving travel time and access around Campbelltown
- Improve access and travel time to Campbelltown Railway Station
- Access to local businesses/industries and other educational and recreational facilities in the area
- Cycleway link to various amenities in the area
- Upgrading of existing two lanes between Clydesdale Drive and Glenroy Drive
- Kerb and gutter and central medians
- Traffic signals at the intersection of Badgally Road and Clydesdale Drive
- Traffic signals at the intersection of Badgally Road and North Steyne Road
- Two lane circulating roundabout at Badgally Road and Glenroy Drive
- Shetland Road will have only left in and out from Badgally Road as the roundabout will be removed and a central median will be installed
- LED street lights
- Drainage
- Shared pathway
- Landscaping

The major components of the works are:

- Construction of two new lanes between Glenroy Drive and North Steyne Road
