# **Purpose**

To update Council on Parklands Early Learning Centre's participation in a trial of the new assessment and ratings process for the implementation of the National Quality Standard.

# **History**

Council at the meeting of 29 June 2010, Community Services Committee was advised of Parklands Early Learning Centre's participation in a trial of the new assessment and ratings process for the implementation of the National Quality Standard.

Council's Parklands Early Learning Centre was included in the trial as one of only two child care centres selected from New South Wales. The centre received a draft guide to the National Quality Standards and completed a self-assessment and quality improvement plan, which includes the assessment and rating tool that assessors reviewed before they visited the service to conduct the assessment in June 2010.

## Report

An assessment team, comprising of a validator from the National Childcare Accreditation Council and a State and Territory licensing officer visited Parklands Early Learning Centre on 18 June 2010 to trial the new assessment and ratings process.

Council received an assessment report confirming that Parklands Early Learning Centre achieved the National Quality Standard in all of the seven quality areas assessed which were Educational Program and Practice, Children's Health and Safety, Physical Environment, Staffing Arrangements, Relationships with Children, Collaborative Partnerships with Families and Communities, Leadership and Service Management.

Council officers attended a meeting on 1 July 2010 where they were asked to provide feedback on the draft assessment and ratings process, including the report on Council's provisional rating.

The quality of the programs and children's learning environments provided at Parklands Early Learning Centre were used as an example and for benchmarking purposes during the feedback and discussion session. Council's Childrens Services was also commended on the new eco friendly play area at the Centre.

Ongoing participation in the assessment process will provide valuable information about the National Quality Standards and Council's performance against each of the Standards for use by the services, as well as providing valuable information and suggestions to further improve and refine the assessment and ratings process.

# **Purpose**

To advise Council of the successful Campbelltown projects funded under the 2009/2010 Community Builders funding.

# History

The Macarthur Area Assistance Scheme and similar schemes in NSW are now known as the Community Builders Program. The first Community Builders funding round opened on 2 November 2009 and closed on 10 December 2009.

Community Builders is a community strengthening and capacity building program, providing funding for time-limited projects in particular areas of NSW.

## Report

Community Builders funds projects that aim to build strength and capacity in communities to deal with issues and respond to change.

Under the new name of Community Builders, the program has been reshaped to operate within selected regions of the Department of Human Services: Community Services. The Metro South West region incorporates the Local Government Areas of Liverpool, Bankstown, Fairfield, Campbelltown, Camden, Wollondilly and Wingecarribee.

Non-government not-for-profit organisations, for-profit organisations (with a separate not-for-profit arm) and local councils can apply for funding under the Community Builders program.

Eligible organisations can apply for funds in three areas:

- Community capacity building
- Community skills development
- Community sector development.

Successful applicants have just been announced. Below is listed the successful Campbelltown Community Builders projects incorporating regional projects.

# **Purpose**

To advise Council of the successful Campbelltown projects funded under the 2010 Community Development and Support Expenditure (CDSE) funding round.

# **History**

The CDSE scheme is a state-wide initiative that recognises the significant financial support for projects and services that NSW Clubs make in contributing to the wellbeing of their communities. Campbelltown City Council and the peak organisation for Community Services in Macarthur and Wingecarribee, Sector Connect, are responsible for overseeing the administration of CDSE across the Campbelltown LGA. CDSE is administered through a Campbelltown Local Committee made up of representatives from local clubs, Council, NSW Department of Human Services, Community Services and Sector Connect.

Council at the meeting of 1 June 2010 endorsed a funding application for Midnight Basketball - Tournaments 4 and 5 for CDSE funding.

## Report

Council was advised that the application for Campbelltown Midnight Basketball Tournaments 4 and 5 was successful for an amount of \$3,000.

A total of \$42,070 was allocated to projects in the Campbelltown Local Government Area through the CDSE Local Committee in the 2010 funding round. A presentation for successful applicants was held on 11 August 2010 at the Ingleburn RSL Club.

# Report

An official Flag Raising Ceremony, speeches and performances were held in front of Council's administration building to launch this year's NAIDOC Week celebrations. The event was attended by about 250 people, and was followed by a Street March to Koshigaya Park.

The Family Fun and Culture Day at Koshigaya Park included entertainment from Aboriginal performers, including local artists, amusements and activities. Over 32 organisations provided information on their services and programs on the day. Approximately 1200 people attended the event.

Sixteen teams participated in the NAIDOC Touch Football Competition at Sarah Redfern Ovals. A range of activities were also provided for younger children attending the event.

Council was successful in gaining support from Macquarie Fields Local Area Command, NSW Department of Sport and Recreation, Campbelltown Family Support Service, Muru Nanga Mai, members of the local Aboriginal community, the Aboriginal Events Working Group and the Seniors Issues Group.

Council also supported a Community Day at Flinders Park, Macquarie Fields on 15 July. The event was coordinated by members of the Macquarie Fields Aboriginal community and Housing NSW and was well attended.

All events were successful and initial feedback from the community, volunteers and service providers was positive. Feedback provided will be used in the planning of the 2011 NAIDOC Week program which will be presented to the Aboriginal Advisory Sub Committee for consideration.

# **Purpose**

To inform Council of the successful application to the Federal Government through the Australia Council for the Arts requesting \$10,000 from the International Visitor's Program.

# History

Council at its meeting of 29 June 2010 endorsed a submission to the Federal Government through the Australia Council for the Arts requesting \$10,000 from the International Visitor's Program to support the invitation of internationally renowned artist Krzysztof Wodiczko to visit Australia in 2011.

# Report

The Campbelltown Arts Centre, in partnership with the cultural institution IASKA in Perth and the Centre for Ideas, University of Melbourne, has invited the internationally renowned artist Krzysztof Wodiczko to undertake a visit to Sydney, Perth and Melbourne in 2011 as part of the Australia Council for the Arts International Visitors Program. The primary purpose of the proposed visit by Wodiczko is to invite the artist to develop a scope for a new major community engaged project that would be co-commissioned by the Campbelltown Arts Centre and IASKA, Perth. It is envisaged that this project (or series of separate projects) would be presented as site-specific public works in Western Sydney and Western Australia.

Krzysztof Wodiczko (b.1943, Warsaw, Poland) has been creating site-specific image and video projections both within galleries and using architectural façades and monuments as backdrops for nearly thirty years. These works of art, which have been shown in over a dozen countries around the world, speak to issues of human rights, democracy and alienation using sound and motion often include testimonies of the people whose plights they address. Krzystof Wodiczko represented Poland in the 2009 Venice Biennale and is a much sought after artist who rarely commits to major projects. The agreement to begin discussions regarding a new work in Australia is a very significant achievement for Campbelltown.

The grant that Campbelltown Arts Centre has received will cover artist fees and all associated travel expenses for Krzysztof Wodiczko's work both in Western Sydney and in Western Australia proposed for 2011. No additional resources would be required by Council.

# **History**

Council at its meeting of 17 September 2002 recommended to adopt Policy No. 4.3.09 Donations to Individuals, Community Organisations, Sports, Cultural and Arts Representatives.

# Report

Residents of Campbelltown who are selected to represent Australia are considered as eligible for financial assistance from Council, as detailed in the objectives of the Donations to Individuals, Community Organisations, Sports, Cultural and Arts Representatives Policy.

The Policy statement details eligible individuals in sport to be "An amateur athlete residing within the Campbelltown City area who has been selected either individually or as a member of a team by the representative National Association to represent his or her country and be entitled to wear the Australian Coat of Arms, may be given a donation of \$500 towards meeting their expenses".

The Policy also provides financial assistance to sporting teams. Teams composed of a majority of residents of the City of Campbelltown who have been selected as a team by the respective National Association to represent the City of Campbelltown at a recognised national or international championship are eligible. A donation of \$1,000 is provided towards meeting the expenses of the team selected.

The 2009/2010 Council made fourteen donations of \$500 to eligible residents. These residents represented Australia in a wide range of sports, including the Australian Athletics team at the 2009 World Youth Championships held in Italy, The Australian BMX team at the World BMX Championships held in Adelaide and representation at the Oceania Inline Hockey which was held in New Zealand.

Council has received positive feedback from participants, recognising that without the Representative Donation Program they would not have been able to achieve their goal of representing Australia in sport.

# Report

Ready to Ride Day is held as part of the Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) 2010 Bike Week. This year the event will be held at Macquarie Road Reserve Macquarie Fields to showcase the new bike track to the community of Campbelltown.

Ready to Ride Day targets persons of all ages and backgrounds from the Campbelltown Local Government Area. The event helps to raise the profile of bicycles in the community as a legitimate form of transport and to encourage bicycle riding to reduce short trip motor vehicle journeys. It also promotes health benefits of cycling and encourages participation in road safety.

The event is designed to promote bicycle safety and education, as well as assist in the education and skills of children and their parents. It also promotes the Bicycle Education Centre and other Council facilities. Free activities will include question and answer activity stations along the cycleway, a skills circuit in which participants practised bicycle skills, bicycle safety checks and education, bicycle safety information displays, face painting, a jumping castle and a barbeque.

Council coordinates Ready to Ride Day and has received \$4,400 from the RTA for the event.

# 5.1 Wireless Internet Access at Glenquarie Library

# **History**

Council at its meeting on 4 May 2010 requested a report into the feasibility of implementing a wireless internet service access at Glenquarie Library.

# Report

Wireless internet (WIFI) access is an increasingly common service found at public libraries across NSW. Campbelltown Library currently maintains free public wireless networks at the HJ Daley, Ingleburn and Eagle Vale Libraries. Demand and use of these services varies greatly from branch to branch and reflects the technological capacity of the local community of users and the general availability of high speed broadband to homes.

To assess the likely need for wireless internet access at Glenquarie Library a user survey was conducted throughout June and July. Existing internet customers and other interested visitors to the Library were asked to complete a short survey indicating the potential audience for WIFI use at the library.

61 surveys were returned with 57 respondents indicating that they would use a free WIFI service at the Library; however only 49 of these respondents indicated that they had a computer or other device with WIFI capabilities. User intentions identified that the majority of potential users (27) would access the service once every week for between 1 and 2 hours.

Quotes for the installation and maintenance of a wireless network at the Library have been sourced and indicate that in the first year the service would cost \$6,018 while in the second year the cost would be \$2685. As many of the potential WIFI users already access the internet using the existing internet computers, we would anticipate a decline in revenue of about \$4,900 from booking fees if WIFI is introduced. There is currently no budget allocation for new WIFI services in the 2010/11 budget.

Since the opening of the new Ingleburn Library, utilisation patterns for the surrounding branch libraries have altered significantly with a net shift towards use of the larger facility. Library staff continue to monitor branch use and customer demand to ensure that the most appropriate range of services are available at all branch service points to meet local demand.

A further report on service delivery through the branch library network will be made in 12 months.
