To advise Council of the events and activities planned for 2012 Children's Week, which will be held from 22 October to 28 October.

Report

Children's Week is an annual event celebrated in Australia, during the fourth week of October.

The Children's Week Council of Australia has a permanent recurring theme: 'A Caring World Shares' as a reflection of Children's Week's aim. There are also annual themes; this year's Children's Week theme is the 'International Year of Sustainable Energy for All'.

Council's Education and Care Services section will be holding activities in all of its services throughout the week with a strong focus on sustainable energy.

Children in Council's Long Day Care, Occasional Care and Outside School Hours Care services will prepare a worm farm with assistance from Council's Waste Section. Other activities will include visits from the local Fire Brigade and Council's Library Services, teddy bears picnics, face painting, messy play activities and mosaic art using sustainable resources.

Family Day Care children, families and educators will participate in teddy bears picnics during each play session held at Family Day Care from 22 October until 2 November 2012. Educators and children will have the opportunity to participate in 'Stufflers-made by you' hand puppets, where the children will be able to pick their choice of a farm animal hand puppet to make and take home.

Campbelltown Child and Family Centre and Amarina Early Learning Centre will hold a 'Little Steps of Green' morning tea to promote sustainability practices in both services. Activities will include creating individual mini seed and sprouting gardens, collage with natural materials such as leaves, dirt and sticks, and nature exploration tables set up with plants, shells and recyclable fun. Information cards containing sustainability tips will be provided to parents attending the morning tea.

Purpose

History

Indent is a project of MusicNSW that plays an important role in the development of all-ages entertainment and provides development support for youth entertainment across the state.

Indent works directly with young people to empower them and help raise awareness of their needs, connecting them with support organisations in their community, providing opportunities, training and valuable experience and involving them in a range of tasks such as booking venues, liaising with police, managing security, organising public liability insurance, advertising and promotion.

Report

Indent grants are awarded to teams of young people (13 - 25) in NSW to stage their own drug and alcohol free events and provides information, resources, advice and support to enable young people to be active in their local music scene and create sustainable youth events.

This year funding is provided through two categories. The Grassroots Grants are set at \$2,500 and are for entry level, small scale local events. The Event Development Grants, which Council proposes to apply under, are set at \$5,000 and are geared at the larger scale events such as Fisher's Gig.

Purpose

To seek Council's endorsement of a submission to the Federal Government through the Australia Council for the Arts, New Work – Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Arts Board for \$35,000 support for the development and production of the multi-disciplinary music theatre work One Billion Beats.

History

Council at the meeting of 27 July 2010, Community Services Committee Item 3.4 One Billion Beats Project Development, was advised of the first stage development of a new contemporary performance work that will continue to be developed over the next three years and will result in a major new Australian theatre work.

Report

The Australia Council for the Arts, New Work – Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Arts Board supports Indigenous musicians and theatre makers to create and present innovative new works that include elements of both music and theatre into the performance. The initiative provides funding towards any singular or multiple stages of development, including creative development of a new work, a second stage development and presentation of a new work.

Campbelltown Arts Centre plan to submit an application to the Australia Council for the Arts requesting \$35,000 to develop the second stage of One Billion Beats, a new music theatre work. One Billion Beats refers to the heartbeats of one billion Indigenous people who lived before colonisation, weaving their stories through the landscape. Combining spoken word poetry, music, song, contemporary theatre techniques and audio visual imagery, One Billion Beats is an excavation of the historical representation of Aboriginal people in Australian film, interlaced with an autobiographical reflection by Romaine Moreton on her experience of being both hostage and liberated from the constraints of Western paradigms in relation to Indigenous identity.

3.3 Australia Council Of The Arts - Indigenous Music Theatre Initiative Funding Submission

One Billion Beats would be scheduled to be delivered as a two stage development from July 2012 - July 2013. At the completion of the final stage of development, Campbelltown Arts Centre would present a showing to potential presentation partners and community networks to discuss the viability of a tour of the production

Campbelltown Athletics Centre is an international standard track and field facility, which has hosted international, national, state and regional competitions as well as being the venue for over 90 school athletics carnivals per year. Campbelltown Athletics Centre is the home of UWS Collegians Athletics Club, which hold senior and junior competitions and training throughout the year.

Report

Campbelltown Athletics Centre has been chosen as the Sydney venue to host the biannual Trans-Tasman Challenge. This is the first time that the centre has hosted this event.

The Trans-Tasman Challenge is for athletes in the under 11 and under 12 age groups of Little Athletics from New South Wales and Auckland, New Zealand. Every second year a team from New South Wales, both boys and girls, travel to Auckland, New Zealand to compete in the Trans-Tasman Challenge and on alternate years a team from Auckland travels to Sydney to compete against a New South Wales team.

The Trans-Tasman Challenge will be held at Campbelltown Athletics Centre on the 13 January 2013.

The UWS Collegians Athletics Club is heavily involved with staging the event and is working with Little Athletics NSW to ensure its success.

This event provides an opportunity to promote the facilities that are available at Campbelltown Athletics Centre. It is anticipated that the successful staging of the Trans-Tasman Challenge will attract more athletics competitions in the future.

Purpose

To inform Council of the projects that have been applied for under the 2012-2013 Sport and Recreation Participation and Facility Program (SRPFP) administrated through Sport and Recreation, a Division of Communities NSW.

History

In previous years, the Sport and Recreation Facility Grants Program provided financial assistance in the form of grants to sporting and other organisations on a dollar for dollar basis up to fifty percent of the total project cost with grants available between \$500 and \$200,000.

The format of the grants program has now changed with a cap of \$50,000 in funding that can be awarded to any one organisation per financial year, and a maximum of \$50,000 grant contribution to any one project.

Council received notification on 2 August 2012 that the application process for the 2012-2013 SRPFP would open on 2 August 2012 and close on 3 September 2012. This would be the first of two rounds with the second round opening in January 2013.

Council at its meeting on 21 August 2012 resolved that a further report be presented with the identified projects submitted to the Office of Communities Sport and Recreation under the SRPFP.

Report

In preparation for the opening of the application process, Council contacted all sporting groups and clubs in the area to identify expressions of interest. Further consultation was undertaken to confirm projects with the respective sporting groups' and clubs' committees, provide scopes of work, proposed costs and finalise applications within the five week timeframe.

Applications closed on Monday 3 September and Council submitted applications for two projects to the Department of Sport and Recreation. The projects, exclusive of GST, are:

The total cost of the projects applied for under the 2012-2013 SRPFP is \$50,500.

If the three applications are successful, Council's contribution to the projects is \$12,750 with the three clubs contributing \$12,750 and Sport and Recreation, Communities NSW providing \$25,000 in funding. Projects would be started after October and need to be completed within 18 months.

Round 2 will open in January 2013. Council would still be eligible to submit further grant applications during this process. The final acceptance of any grant is subject to Council signing the funding agreement.

Council Officers have been advised that some local clubs are also applying for grants under the State Government's 2012 Community Building Partnership Program. A further report will be presented to Council with a list of projects that clubs have requested Council assistance to support infrastructure upgrades to local playing fields.

Hosting these matches is a continued endorsement of Campbelltown Sports Stadium's capabilities of hosting national sporting events and will further enhance its reputation as a premier regional sporting facility. It also provides an opportunity to work with the new Western Sydney Wanderers Club to promote further opportunities in the Macarthur area.

He graduated from Sydney University and trained at St Vincents Hospital in Sydney and St Bartholomews hospital in London. Purpose

To inform Council that the Library Service will be holding a 2012 Food for Fines Amnesty.

History

Council at the meeting of 13 March 2012 resolved to again conduct a Food for Fines Amnesty during October-November 2012.

Report

Council's Library Service ran the first Food for Fines Amnesty in December 2011 with food items being donated to the Mayor's Christmas Appeal. Following a review of the success of the program it was recommended that the timing of the amnesty be adjusted as December is traditionally a quieter period for Library Services.

Food for Fines amnesties are seen as a positive approach to addressing long overdue items and accumulated fines in that they encourage the return of long overdue material, can significantly reduce the financial burden of Library members who may have accrued fines and the act of making a donation of a food item to charity helps to create a greater sense of community, while assisting those in need.

It is proposed that the Food for Fines Amnesty run for a period of seven weeks commencing on 15 October and concluding on 30 November 2012. During the amnesty period, fines would be waived subject to the outstanding library items being returned in good order and on receipt of a donation of food items packaged in undamaged tins or other long life packaging that is in date and to the approximate value of the total fine.

The amnesty would not apply to fees charged for lost or damaged items, or Inter Library Loan Fees. If a library member does not wish to contribute a food item the normal fines process would apply.
