Purpose

To inform Council of the Australian Child Care Week 2012 Awards held on Saturday 17 November 2012.

Report

The Australian Child Care Week 2012 Awards is an inspirational acknowledgement of the finest and most innovative activities presented by Early Learning Child Care Services during Australian Child Care Week. The awards acknowledge the important role services play in the community and the countless hours that services dedicate to caring for and educating young children.

The award categories cover a wide spectrum of honours. There is an award designed for all kinds of activities and all levels of involvement including individuals, teams, programs and activities.

Over 1,400 applications were submitted for the New South Wales awards. Twelve of Council's Education and Care Services submitted applications in the 16 categories including Best Community Involvement, Best Activity, Best Program Involving Families, Best Sustainable Activity or Program, Best Overall Program, Best Multicultural Activity or Program and Creative Expression.

All of Council's services that submitted applications were among the 230 overall State finalists. The Awards were attended by Council representatives where the winners of the 16 overall categories were announced.

The Australian Child Care Week Awards are an opportunity to help raise the public profile of the key role Education and Care Services play in the lives of children, their families and the broader community. Council's services were compared to many other services in the state making this a great accolade for Campbelltown City Council and Education and Care Services.

1.2 Review of In Home Care Places

Purpose

To advise Council of the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR) review of continuously unutilised In Home Care places.

History

In Home Care (IHC) is a flexible form of early childhood education and care where an approved educator provides care in the child's home. Unlike other care types, IHC is only available to children who meet certain eligibility criteria and where mainstream child care services are not suitable or are unable to meet the families care needs.

Recent amendments to the Child Care Benefit (Allocation of Child Care Places) Determination 2000 (the Allocation Determination) requires the number of places that have been allocated to a service to be reduced if these places have been unoccupied continuously for six months or more.

The Department is recalling consistently unoccupied places to maximise the benefit of the number of IHC places available by redirecting them to regions where the places are more likely to be utilised.

Report

Since July 2001 Council has operated a 20 place IHC service administered by the Family Day Care Service. Utilisation of Council's IHC service has continuously been low and there are currently only three families with seven children enrolled. The low utilisation could be accredited to the high cost and specific criteria required to access the service.

Council has been advised that DEEWR will be reducing the current allocation of 20 IHC places to 15 places, a reduction of five places in total.

Due to continued low utilisation during the time Council has provided this service, Education and Care Services proposed to return an additional eight unutilised IHC places to DEEWR for reallocation. This would mean the Council IHC service would operate with only the seven utilised places, enabling continued support for the current three families.

1.3 Cancer Council Sun Smart Launch for Outside School Hours Care

Purpose

To inform Council of Campbelltown City and Raby Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) services endorsement by the NSW Cancer Council as Sun Smart services.

Report

Council's nine Long Day Care Services, one Occasional Care Service and Family Day Care Scheme are all endorsed as Sun Smart services by the NSW Cancer Council.

Sun exposure in the first fifteen years of life is linked to the increased likelihood of skin cancer, including melanoma, as an adult. The Cancer Council has developed the Sun Smart Primary School program; a free national program that provides schools with sun protection guidelines, policy and curriculum resources. The program, introduced in October 2012 recognises and values the sun protection principles schools are currently addressing while supporting the school to extend their commitment towards the adoption of 10 Sun Smart recommendations.

The NSW Cancer Council recognises that OSHC services are a significant setting for promoting positive sun protection behaviour and have the potential to make an important contribution to reducing the lifetime risk of skin cancer of children.

Campbelltown City and Raby OSHC applied to be endorsed as Sun Smart services and were accepted into the pilot of the program. To achieve this, Council's services were required to submit a copy of their service's Sun Protection Policy that covers the 10 Sun Smart recommendations. These include scheduling outdoor activities outside of peak UV times, providing shade structures, encouraging children to wear sun-safe hats, clothing and sunglasses, role modelling of staff, providing sun protection principles in teaching programs, providing sun protection information to families, and regularly monitoring and reviewing the effectiveness of the Sun Protection Policy.

Council's two OSHC services were among the first in New South Wales to be endorsed as OSHC Sun Smart services by the NSW Cancer Council and were recognised and presented with a certificate at the official launch of the program held on 26 November 2012.

Purpose

To provide Council with an evaluation report on Fisher's Gig 2012.

Report

Fisher's Gig, Council's annual youth music festival, was held on Saturday 3 November 2012 at Bradbury Oval between 2.00pm and 9.00pm as part of the Festival of Fisher's Ghost. The event was very successful with approximately 2,500 young people attending the event throughout the day.

Fisher's Gig is recognised as a professional platform for aspiring musicians and provides a supportive environment for young people to develop skills in event management and performance. It also provides a large scale youth event where young people are free to engage with and celebrate youth culture in a safe, drug and alcohol free environment.

Performers

The local performer line up was selected this year through a pre-selection heat process. Five local acts had the opportunity to perform at Fisher's Gig 2012 including '46 Clicks', 'Go Mason Go', 'Paintbox City', 'Carmeria' and 'The Masterplan'. Headlining performers this year included Western Australian based rock group 'Hunting Grounds', Melbourne based group 'Closure In Moscow' and Sydney based 'Self Is A Seed'.

Youth Volunteering

Twenty eight young people volunteered in the running of the event including members of Council's Youth Entertainment Reference Group and local young people interested in beginning careers in the music industry. Volunteers played a key role in the coordination of the event on the day, with four teams operating on site under the direction of experienced volunteer team leaders. The teams gained practical experience in staging/backstage coordination, sound/lighting technician work, customer service and performer liaison duties.

There was great support for Fisher's Gig 2012 from media and business. Four articles were published in the Macarthur Advertiser prior to and after the event, providing a platform to positively promote local bands and headlining acts.

Fisher's Gig 2012 attracted in-kind sponsorship of over \$10,000 from a range of businesses including Somerset Music, Indent NSW, Patti's Hire, The Music Box Staging and Production Services and C91.3 radio station.

The branding and poster artwork for the event was provided by two graphic design students from TAFE NSW. Council received over 20 poster entries this year. The successful students were provided with on the job experience in developing marketing material and enhancing their skills in graphic design software. Branding material included event-shirts, badges, Facebook banners and posters.

Environmental Initiatives

Fisher's Gig has firmly established a reputation for promoting environmental awareness and sustainability by embracing opportunities to reduce the event's carbon footprint.

This year, Fisher's Gig 2012 sought to encourage young people to think sustainably and engage with simple and practical things that can be achieved on a daily basis to reduce their environmental impact.

An environmental pledge photo booth was provided and was run by Council's Youth Entertainment Reference Group. Founded on the premise that it takes 21 days to break a bad habit, attendees were provided with options of eight different pledges in the areas of transport, water, energy and waste. Interesting facts were also provided to raise awareness about the associated environmental benefit from their pledge.

Overall the environmental pledge photo booth was considered to be a success with over 40 attendees taking part. Popular pledges included reducing shower times and turning off the lights when leaving a room.

2.2 ComPacks Funding Agreement 2012-2015

Purpose

To seek Council's endorsement of the Service Agreement between New South Wales Community Options Projects Incorporated and Campbelltown City Council for \$213,000 annually (GST exclusive) for the ComPacks program for 2012-2015 through Macarthur Community Options.

Report

Acute care services in hospitals are a major driver of costs in the public health system. Excessive lengths of stay and readmission rates are key problem areas in managing these costs. Most people who spend longer periods in hospital or who have frequent admissions are elderly or have complex conditions.

The ComPacks program is an important response to these problems. It is widely recognised that people prefer to be in their own homes as soon as they are well enough. Unfortunately for the elderly and those with complex needs, the necessary support services are not often available. ComPacks provides a source of funding and reduces the high cost of acute care per patient.

Through ComPacks, a broker, such as Macarthur Community Options, can purchase services such as personal care, housekeeping and transport. These services are provided for up to six weeks following discharge from hospital. This enables the patient to recuperate in the home environment with appropriate support and at a much lower cost than if they were in hospital. Lower readmission rates are another benefit as the support provided overcomes the problems that can arise from premature hospital discharge. Hospital beds are freed up through this process, enabling access for others.

ComPacks funding across NSW was recently the subject of a tender by NSW Health, with New South Wales Community Options Projects Incorporated being successful in receiving funding for many areas, including Macarthur. Campbelltown City Council is a member of NSW Community Options, and has received ComPacks funding since 2006. Council would enter into a service agreement with the Community Options NSW for \$213,000 annually (GST exclusive) for ComPacks services for the period 1 December 2012 to 30 June 2015.

All costs that are incurred in the delivery of ComPacks are covered by the funding provided by the NSW Department of Health.

The Medibank Community Fund Community Grants program operates in each Australian State and across New Zealand. It supports grassroots community programs that perform important roles in their local regions to encourage better health and wellbeing.

The Medibank Community Fund is investing in local initiatives that promote healthy eating and greater community connectedness in local communities. This fund is therefore a potential source of funding for the Midnight Basketball program, which offers amongst other things healthy meals and greater community connectedness.

Council staff are continually exploring partnerships and funding opportunities to ensure the continuation of the Midnight Basketball program. Should the funding application be successful this would provide Council with further funding to support Tournaments 10 and 11 of the Midnight Basketball Program.

Purpose

To seek Council's endorsement of the submission for Macarthur Community Options to become a provider for the Australian Government's Consumer Directed Packaged Care for people over 65 years.

History

For over 21 years Macarthur Community Options, under the management of Campbelltown City Council has provided services for aged and disabled people and their carers in the Macarthur Area. A case manager works with clients to provide access to services such as personal care, domestic assistance, medical and social transport, counselling advocacy, family support and therapy services. The case manager oversees, monitors, reviews and evaluates the services on behalf of the clients, at the same time building the confidence and skills of the clients to increase their independence and skills. Community Options clients have complex needs and funding is provided to enable them to remain in their own homes, with support services in place for as long as possible.

Report

Consumer Directed Packaged Care is an initiative of the Australian Government for selected community aged care providers to deliver innovative service models, which will provide care recipients and their carers with greater control over the design and delivery of the care services they receive.

Consumer Directed Packaged Care places are only allocated to existing Approved Providers as defined under the *Aged Care Act 1997* and are only allocated to Providers who are approved to provide flexible care.

Macarthur Community Options has been recognised for their expertise and experience in the area of complex case management for frail aged through the invitation to apply for the allocation of Consumer Directed Packaged Care places.

Purpose

To update Council on the 2012 Festival of Fisher's Ghost Art Award presentations.

Report

The 50th Fisher's Ghost Art Award, a highlight of Campbelltown's annual Fisher's Ghost Festival, was officially launched on Friday 2 November 2012. The opening night attracted over 500 guests, artists, and families from Campbelltown and the Greater Sydney area.

The Award is open to any artist, Australia wide with the option of entering up to two works of art. Six hundred and seventy works from 522 artists were received, a significant increase on previous years.

This year's Open Award was valued at \$40,000 – making the Fisher's Ghost Art Award one of the richest and most sought after art prizes in the country.

Fisher's Ghost Art Award sponsors include Campbelltown City Council, Cameron Brae, Campbelltown Catholic Club, Clinton Motors Group, Coonamble Shire Council, Friends of Campbelltown Arts Centre, Labor Party Councillors, Liberal Party Councillors, Marsdens Law Group, Rotary Club of Campbelltown, Rotary Club of Ingleburn, Western Suburbs Leagues Club and Kerry Walsh.

This year, Council welcomed several new sponsors to the award particularly Inghams, and Max and Nola Tegel.

The winner of Campbelltown City Council and Friends of Campbelltown Arts Centre's Open Award was Raquel Ormella for her work 'Poetic Possibility'. Ms Ormella is a Sydney artist who works across various media investigating the means by which critical reflexivity in contemporary art encourages processes of self-examination regarding political consciousness and social action. This work will now become part of the Campbelltown Arts Centre's Permanent Collection.

Purpose

To update Council on the 2012 Fisher's Kids Program at Campbelltown Arts Centre

Report

Fisher's Kids 2012 was held at Campbelltown Arts Centre on Sunday 4 November 2012 as part of the Festival of Fisher's Ghost. Fisher's Kids is managed by Cultural Services in partnership with Education and Care Services. The aim of Fisher's Kids is to deliver a program of cultural activities within the Festival that specifically targets young families within the Macarthur region.

Campbelltown Arts Centre has continued to develop Fisher's Kids to provide opportunities for young families to engage with a high quality and dynamic children's program that includes both visual artists and performers.

The highlight of the performance program was 'My Tiny World' a new program for three to eight year old children, commissioned by Campbelltown Arts Centre by Polyglot Theatre.

'My Tiny World' was conceived as an interactive performance installation involving the use of camping tents as painting canvases. The tents were used to create an interactive performance that ran throughout the four hours of the Festival of Fisher's Kids.

Polyglot Artistic Director, Susan Giles led three artists to deliver a series of workshops at Campbelltown Arts Centre in the lead up to the Festival of Fisher's Ghost. One hundred and twenty local children aged between four and eight years travelled to Campbelltown Arts Centre from John Warby Public School, Camden South Public School, Rosemeadow Public School, Ingleburn Public School, Ooranga Wandarrah Aboriginal Child Care and Bargo Public School to work with the Polyglot artists.

The tents were worn as garments in the Fisher's Ghost Street Parade to give the local community a preview of what to expect at Fisher's Kids held on Sunday.

At the conclusion of the Festival the tents were offered to schools and childcare centres as a resource for further educational and creative play experiences.

Other activities offered at the event included children's Koi fish art workshops, an interactive reading corner, construction area, water play and bubble blowing and an exhibition of artworks by children from Council's Education and Care Services.

Approximately 300 people attended Fisher's Kids 2012. Feedback from the audience on the day indicated there is strong support for the continued development of this program to provide opportunities for young families to experience live music and theatre within the local area.

History

Council at its meeting on 5 June 2012 endorsed a submission to Arts NSW Triennial Program funding to support the 2013-2015 operations and programs of the Campbelltown Arts Centre.

Report

The NSW State Government's Triennial Program Funding 2013–2015 is available for arts and cultural organisations that are central to the cultural life of NSW. The program is only available to organisations that have demonstrated ongoing commitment to strategic partnerships and a high level of strategic importance in terms of their regionality and the type of arts and cultural activities that they are delivering.

The invitation for Council to apply for Triennial Program Funding is a significant recognition from the State Government of the contribution that Campbelltown Arts Centre is making to arts and cultural development within NSW. This is the second consecutive invitation to apply for Triennial Funding, with the first three year funding cycle concluding in 2012.

The \$240,000 per annum that has been confirmed by the Minister for the Arts, the Hon George Souris, MP, will support the delivery of the principle annual artistic program and activities for the Centre's 2013-2015 programs. This would include professional fees, administration and annual production costs.

To provide Council with a summary of events held at Campbelltown Sports Stadium in 2012.

History

Campbelltown Sports Stadium consists of an international standard athletics track and one of NSW's premier regional football facilities. Campbelltown Sports Stadium is capable of hosting a variety of events.

Report

In 2012 Campbelltown Sports Stadium hosted 167 sport and community events. The diversity of events held at Campbelltown Sports Stadium recognises the capabilities of the venue with its easy parking, quality facilities, playing surface and public transport links.

Campbelltown Football Stadium

In 2012 Campbelltown Football Stadium hosted 148 games of rugby league and soccer/football. This comprised of the following:

Report

The Fisher's Ghost Fun Run has been an integral part of Campbelltown City's Festival of Fisher's Ghost for 37 years. The 37th annual Marsdens Law Group Fisher's Ghost Fun Run was staged between the grounds of the University of Western Sydney's Campbelltown Campus and TAFE NSW Western Sydney Campbelltown Campus on Sunday 11 November 2012.

The event has a naming rights sponsor in Marsdens Law Group, which is the second year of a three year agreement. The event was promoted as proudly presented by Campbelltown City Council, with three major sponsors and seven minor sponsors. The race was started by Campbelltown Olympian, Daniel Tranter.

There were 880 registered entrants, an increase of 80 competitors compared to the 2011 event.

The success of the event is due largely to the contribution from the Campbelltown Joggers Club. The Club not only foregoes running in their own local event, but provides almost 100 volunteers to run the event with Council, including processing entries, setting up the course, marshalling the race itself, collating results, and managing the electronic timing system.

The sunny weather conditions suited the runners this year. A BBQ stall was run by Campbelltown Rotary Club and Council's Education Care Services staff provided child minding, which all contributed to the great success on the day.

History

The Bicycle Education and Road Safety Centre located at the end of King Street was established 23 years ago in 1989. The Centre provides educational programs for groups including preschools, schools and people with special needs. It is available for private hire seven days a week and also provides 100 free open days for the community each year.

Open days are free for the general public and are held every Sunday and during the NSW public school holidays from 10.00am to 3.00pm. A total of 7800 visitors attended the Centre during open days in the 2011-2012 financial year.

Report

A program to provide different activities at the Bicycle Education and Road Safety Centre during the free open days has been developed to increase the community's awareness of the Centre and to assist parents in keeping their children active during the six week school holiday period.

The program includes an education competition which requires children to ride around the track to gain answers to complete their quiz and other organised activities.

National Rugby League 2013 Draw

Purpose

To advise Council of Campbelltown Sports Stadium's hire arrangements for the 2013 rugby league season.

History

In 2012 Campbelltown Sports Stadium hosted four National Rugby League (NRL) matches. In addition to this the Stadium was the home venue for the Western Suburbs District Rugby League Football Club who participated in the New South Wales Rugby League Cup. Western Suburbs District Junior Rugby League and the Macarthur District Soccer Football Club also held their final series at the venue.

In a typical year the Stadium hosts between 130 - 160 football matches ranging from NRL to local club and school matches.

Wests Tigers have used a number of venues since 2000 as their home ground including Campbelltown Sports Stadium, Leichhardt Oval, ANZ Stadium, Sydney Football Stadium (Allianz Stadium) and the Sydney Cricket Ground. Three Wests Tigers games per annum were held at the venue between 2005 and 2009, and prior to this five or six games were held at the Stadium. Since 2010 four matches have been held at the Stadium and in 2011 and 2012 Campbelltown Sports Stadium also hosted a Wests Tigers trial match.

Report

The National Rugby League Commission has released the 2013 National Rugby League (NRL) draw which comprises of 26 rounds of competition. Wests Tigers have twelve home games with four of these to be played at Campbelltown Sports Stadium. A further four games will be held at Leichhardt Oval; five home games being played at the Sydney Football Stadium (Allianz Stadium) with the remaining home game scheduled to be played at the Sydney Cricket Ground.

The four NRL matches scheduled for Campbelltown Sports Stadium in 2013 are as follows:

In 2013 Wests Tigers will be fielding a NSW Cup team for the first time. This is a merged Wests Magpies and Balmain Ryde Eastwood Tigers team, unlike the two separate teams, which have participated in the NSW Cup since the Wests Tigers merger. It is envisaged that half of the Wests Tigers NSW Cup matches will be played at the Stadium and the other half at Leichardt Oval.

An approach has also been made to Council from the Western Suburbs Rugby League Football Club who are now participating the NSW Rugby League third tier competition, the Bundaberg Cup, to use the Stadium for their home ground.

The NSW Cup draw and the Bundaberg Cup draw are due to be released in January 2013.

In order for Council to plan and schedule events to be held at the Stadium, requests for hire need to be carefully assessed to ensure that there is a balance between the use of the facility for NRL fixtures, representative matches, the local community and the specific turf maintenance requirements. Council also needs ensure that the management remains flexible so opportunities for other events are pursued and can be accommodated.

Council previously has resolved to adopt the following ranking system in order to prioritise use of the Stadium:

Purpose

To advise Council of the Summer Reading Club that will be run as part of the Library Services' school holiday program from 3 December 2012 until 20 January 2013.

Report

The Summer Reading Club is a national program, run in conjunction with the State Library of Queensland. The program was developed in response to research showing that for many children a reduction in reading during the school holiday break in December-January can lead to a marked drop in reading ability at the beginning of the new school year. The aim of this program is to encourage children up to 16 years, to continue reading over the school holiday period through keeping a log of their reading and becoming eligible for book prizes on achieving set reading goals.

In 2011-2012 over 19,000 children participated in the program nationally and over 360 locally. The feedback from both children and parents was extremely positive with many of last year's participants having already expressed interest in being involved again this year.

The program plays an important role in engaging children, young people and their families in a fun, interactive and relevant reading program during the summer holidays. It supports multi-literacy development in children and young people including reading, writing, creative arts and multimedia technology skills while fostering a love of reading, literature and libraries.

Registration in the Club is free and when participants register at any branch of Campbelltown Library they will receive a Summer Reading Club Pack. In addition, children may also register through the Summer Reading Club website www.summerreadingclub.org.au where they will have access to additional information, games and activities.

Participants may read both fiction and non-fiction, and all books must be suitable for their age and reading level. Each time a child reads a book or has a book read to them they record the book in their reading log. When a log is completed, it can be handed in at any library branch for entry into the lucky draw. All participants will be invited to celebrate the completion of the program with an afternoon tea, including activities and prize draws.
