I refer to the above matter and advise that Council has received concerns regarding students crossing Moore Oxley Bypass.



Thank you for your letter of 10 January 2013 expressing your concern about the Statewide application of the Aquifer Interference Policy.

When this Policy was publicly exhibited for comment it was proposed that it would apply initially only in areas covered by Strategic Regional Land Use Plans. However, in finalising the Policy, a decision was made that it would apply to the whole of NSW. The effect of this is that advice can be provided by the NSW Office of Water to the appropriate decision making body on the impacts of any major aquifer interference activity proposed in any part of the State, including mines and coal seam gas activities that are classified as State significant developments.

I understand that officers from the NSW Office of Water met with staff from Campbelltown City Council on 22 January 2013 to explain how the Aquifer Interference Policy would apply within the Campbelltown Local Government Area (LGA).

Also, since release of the Aquifer Interference Policy, the NSW Government has introduced further measures designed to protect land and associated water resources from coal seam gas activities. The most significant of these for the Campbelltown LGA is the introduction of buffer zones around residential areas, which will prevent new CSG activities from occurring within these zones.

#### Aquifer Interference Policy

I refer to Council's submission on the draft Aquifer Interference Policy (AIP), dated 11 May 2012, which viewed the preparation of the AIP as a welcome initiative in response to the potential impacts on water resources through coal and gas seam mining activities.

However, Council wishes to express concern over the extended application of the AIP from Biophysical Strategic Agricultural Land located in the Upper Hunter and North West regions of New South Wales to the whole of NSW. This extended application of the AIP without consultation has prevented Council from undertaking a full analysis and providing appropriate comment on the AIP within the context of the Campbelltown Local Government Area.

Consequently, at its meeting on 20 November 2012 Council resolved to:

Write to the NSW Minister for Planning and Infrastructure and NSW Minister for Primary Industries expressing concern and disappointment to the expansion of the Aquifer Interference Policy to apply Statewide without appropriate consultation with Council.

Council continues to hold concern over the failure of the AIP to fully address issues raised in Council's submissions on both the Bulli Seam and Camden Gas Projects. In this regard Council has further resolved to request a meeting with the NSW Office of Water to discuss these issues.

Thank you for your enquiry regarding smoke-free sports grounds. As you are aware, following amendments to the *Smoke-free Environment Act 2000*, smoking is banned at spectator areas of sports grounds and other recreational areas whilst organised sporting events are being held.

The ban applies only for organised sporting events held at public sports grounds or other recreational areas. The law applies to both covered and uncovered spectator areas and whether seating is provided or not.

A spectator area is defined as an area that is set aside for, or is used by spectators, to watch an organised sporting event at a sports ground or other recreational area. Due to the diverse range of sporting grounds and recreational facilities, the definition of a spectator area is deliberately broad to ensure that all areas where spectators congregate to watch a sporting event are included. Viewing screens set up at sporting grounds or recreational areas specifically for spectators, for example: greyhound racing or tennis would also generally be covered by the legislation and would need to be smoke-free as these could be considered areas which are specifically in place for people to congregate to watch the sporting event.

A recreational area is used to refer to any other outdoor public area (not considered a sports ground) being used for an organised sporting event. This may include areas such as a local park or a beach (for the purposes of a surf life-saving carnival, beach volley-ball or a formally organised beach cricket event). As with sporting grounds, the smoking ban applies only when an organised sporting event is being held.

Other events which are not organised sporting events (eg. markets, concerts or other public gatherings) are not covered by this legislation. The areas targeted for reform under the recent amendments to the *Smoke-free Environment Act 2000* are those which are frequented by families and young children in which people have limited opportunity to avoid second-hand smoke.

I note that local councils are not precluded from creating and enforcing smoke-free outdoor areas policies within their local areas which go beyond the provisions of the *Smoke-free Environment Act 2000* by utilising their powers under the *Local Government Act 1993*. I would encourage local councils to consider such initiatives within their local area.
