List of proposed road names

Road Name	Origin
University Drive	The Macarthur Institute of Higher Education was founded in 1984 and was officially opened on 27 November 1987. It became the third member university of the University of Western Sydney on 1 November 1989. From the beginning of 2001, the University of Western Sydney has been a single multi-campus university with six campuses, including the Campbelltown Campus. University Drive is proposed to be the name of the main collector road that links all the residential stages within the "University Influences" sub-theme area.
Goldsmith Avenue	This is an existing name used for a road within the UWS Campbelltown Campus. Currently this is a private road, but it will be partially realigned, extended and eventually dedicated to the public as part of this development. John Goldsmith was granted Portion 154 in the Parish of St Peter in 1816. The first section of this road, from its intersection with Gilchrist Drive, is located within the boundaries of this land grant.
Andromeda Street	The Andromeda Galaxy is a spiral galaxy approximately 2.5 million light-years from Earth in the Andromeda constellation.
Australis Street	Corona Australis is a constellation in the Southern Hemisphere. Its Latin name means "southern crown".
Centaurus Street	Centaurus is a bright constellation in the southern sky. In Greek mythology, Centaurus represents a centaur, a creature that is half man, half horse.
Galileo Street	Galileo Galilei (15 February 1564 – 8 January 1642), was an Italian physicist, mathematician, astronomer, and philosopher, who has been called the "father of modern observational astronomy".
Lunar Place	Lunar is a term used in relation to the moon, Earth's only natural satellite, and the fifth largest moon in the Solar System.
Milky Way	The Milky Way is the galaxy that contains our Solar System. Its name "milky" is derived from its appearance as a dim glowing band arching across the night sky in which the naked eye cannot distinguish individual stars.
Nano Place	The Nanoscale Organisation and Dynamics Group (Nano) is a multidisciplinary research team within the School of Science and Health at UWS, whose ultimate aim is to establish UWS as an internationally recognised research group for molecular association, organisation and dynamics, with an emphasis on nanobiotechnical and nanomedical applications.
Orion Street	Orion is a prominent constellation located on the celestial equator and visible throughout the world. It was named after Orion, a hunter in Greek mythology.
Pegasus Street	Pegasus is a constellation in the northern sky, named after the winged horse Pegasus in Greek mythology.
Vega Street	Vega is the brightest star in the constellation Lyra, and the fifth brightest star in the night sky.
